Better Internet
for Kids

You have rights online just like anywhere else

For example, you have the right to
privacy and data protection.

The same goes for other children
and young people – they have the
same rights as you! **That's why it's
important to show respect and
consideration for others online.**





Right to Equal Access

All children have the right to access the internet and technology to learn, play, and connect with others online – no matter where they live or where they come from.

States and society should work to reduce the digital divide and ensure that no one is left behind.



Right to Have a Voice in Decisions

You have the right to take part when rules and services that affect children online are being created.

Designers and companies should listen to children's opinions when developing new apps, games, and social media.



Right to Protection of Privacy

You have the right for your data and personal information not to be collected or shared without permission.

You have the right to know what data about you is being used or shared, to change it, or to have it deleted.



Right to Information

You have the right to find reliable, diverse, and easy-to-understand information online.

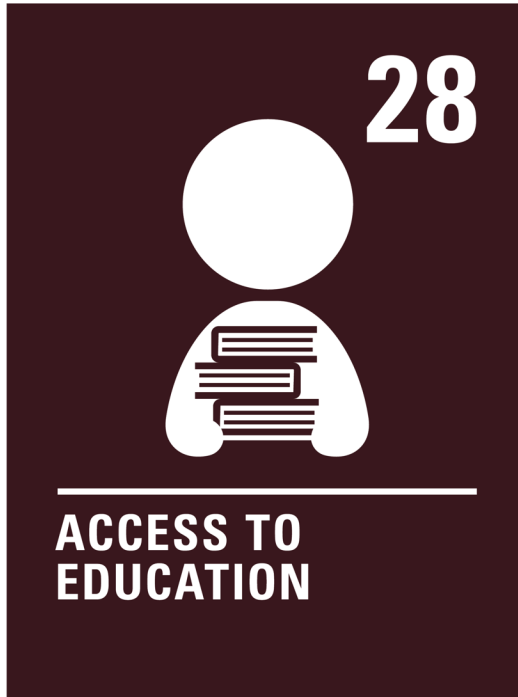
You have the right to education on how to recognize false or harmful information.



Right to Protection and Safety

You have the right to be protected from violence, harassment, bullying, hate speech, scams, and abuse online.

You have the right to services and tools that are designed with children's safety in mind (e.g. safe settings, age-appropriate content).



Right to Learn and Create

The internet should help you learn, explore the world, create, and come up with new ideas.

You have the right to media literacy – to learn to use technology safely and responsibly.



Right to Play and Free Time

You can use the internet to play, have fun, and communicate with friends.

You also have the right to screen-free time – balance between online activities and offline daily life is important.



Right to Help

If you feel bad or are in danger online, you have the right to support, assistance, and safe ways to report problems.

This help must be free, confidential, and accessible to all children.



Everyone Must Know Children's Rights

Governments should educate children and adults about the Convention on the Rights of the Child regularly so that everyone knows about children's rights.
